Frequently Asked Questions

Q. If I don't receive a confirmation of my registration, does that mean it wasn't received?
A. Generally we don't send confirmations. In most cases your badge and tickets are waiting for you at the registration desk.

Q. What if my school sent my registration, but it was not received by the conference registrars?
A. This problem happens more often than you would think. What schools say they have done is not always true. If this should happen be prepared with a copy of the school's purchase order including a purchase order number. At the very least have your school business office telephone number. We will be happy to call to verify that your registration will be paid.

Q. I did send my registration, I'm very sure of that, but you have no record of its having been received?
A. In a rare case like this we have to ask you to pay again for your registration. If you receive the original canceled check in the mail, we will gladly reimburse you for the second registration.

Q. Which credit cards do you take?
A. We can take **MasterCard, American Express, Discover and Visa**. Any credit card transactions must take place at the conference and at the on-site registration rate.

Q. Why are purchase orders charged more for a registration?
A. There are extra costs associated with purchase orders. While most school systems are efficient and pay their bills in a timely manner, some school systems must be contacted numerous times before they pay their bills. This involves extra secretarial help.

Q. Can I trade a badge with a fellow teacher if I can't attend the whole conference?
A. If you have purchased a single registration you may not give that registration badge to a different person.

Q. What is a district pass and how does it work?
A. Realizing that some districts were having a hard time finding the money to send large delegations to NERC, we instituted a new form of registration called a district pass. For \$175 (\$200 after March 1, 2010), a district can send **one person each day** to the conference. The badge is given to the teacher for that day at the registration desk. **At the end of the day, that badge must be returned to the registration desk.** No new badges will be produced if the district badge is lost or left at home. It is at the discretion of the district whether 2, 3, or 4 people share the badge, but only one person can use it each day. You must submit a registration form for each person who is using the badge. Please note that all the people who use the badge must be from the same school district. The district pass registration form is on page 66. Reproduce it as needed and send all the registration forms and purchase order or check together to the Maine address on the form.

Q. How do I qualify as a student?
A. The purpose of the student rate is to allow pre-service teachers who are attending college to be introduced to a professional conference at a nominal fee. Teachers who are taking courses do **not** qualify for this privilege. Students must show a current identification card from a college or university.

Q. What happens if it snows during the conference. Can I get my preregistration fee back?
A. If the conference is running, there can be no refunds for bad weather. Preregistration rates are less than on-site rates because there is a small risk involved. If the weather or any other occurrence were bad enough to cancel the conference, all preregistration monies would be refunded.

Q. If I have any problems with the conference, where can I speak to an official?
A. Members of the planning committee wear easily identifiable ribbons and usually take part in all the events. If, however, you can't find anyone to speak to, you can always come to the registration desk. It's important to remember that this conference is run by teachers just like you. We want your experience to be a good one. We'll do whatever we can to resolve your problem.

Please let us know at the registration desk if there are any other questions you would like to see answered in the next conference brochure.

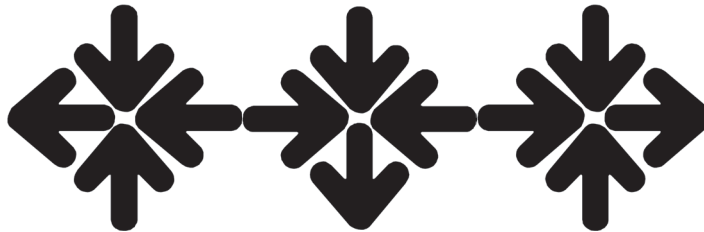

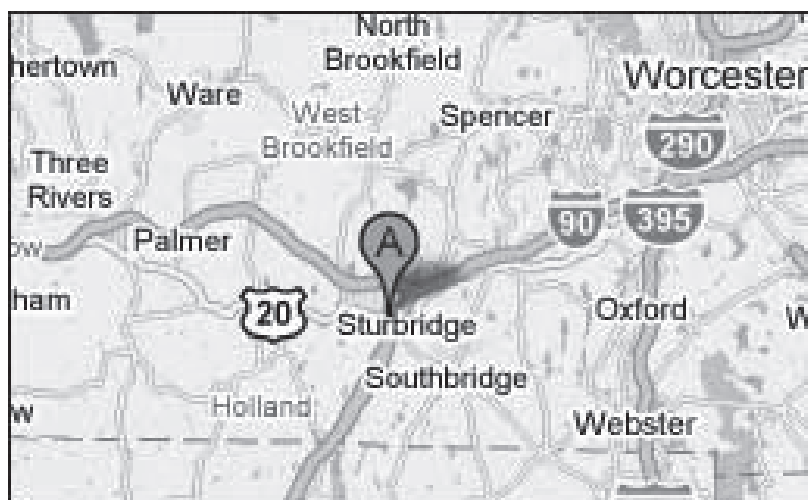

GETTING TO THE CONFERENCE SITE

DRIVING DIRECTIONS: Sturbridge Host Hotel & Conference Center is located on Route 20. From the North, East and West, take the Massachusetts Turnpike (Interstate 90) to Exit 9, Route 20 West. From the South, take either Interstate 84 or Route 131 to Route 20 West. Sturbridge Host Hotel & Conference Center is located on the shore of Cedar Lake, just past the first set of traffic lights.

AIRPORT & TRANSPORTATION. Sturbridge Host Hotel & Conference Center is conveniently located near Logan International Airport in Boston (62 miles), Bradley International Airport near Hartford, Connecticut (50 miles), and TF Green Airport near Providence, Rhode Island (60 miles). Worcester Regional Airport is approximately 30 miles from the hotel.



HOTEL RESERVATIONS—Sleeping room reservations may be made by completing and returning the room reservation form on page 66. **RETURN IT DIRECTLY TO THE STURBRIDGE HOST HOTEL BY February 28, 2010.** This insures the special room rate.

PARKING—Parking at the hotel is free.

PACKAGE DELIVERY—The hotel will not accept shipment of goods or materials more than 48 hours in advance of client's arrival. Hotel will apply a storage fee for all property stored at the hotel for more than 48 hours, fee not to exceed \$5.00 per parcel. Client acknowledges and agrees that arrangements by hotel for receipt and storage of any shipment is done solely as an accommodation and convenience to client. The hotel is not an insurer of client's property, and any such arrangements do not create a bailment either express or implied. All risk for any loss, theft, damage or destruction to any personal property shipped to or stored at the hotel is borne by the client. PRE-REGISTRATION—Everyone who attends all or part of the 41st NERC MUST REGISTER. This includes program committee members, council officers, presenters, and staff. The normal pre-registration fee is \$120.00. The pre-registration fee for a member of a sponsoring group is \$100.00. In order to qualify for the member-reduced rate, you must be a dues paying member of one of the following: Massachusetts Council for the Social Studies, Vermont Alliance for the Social Studies, New Hampshire Council for the Social Studies, Maine Council for the Social Studies, Rhode Island Social Studies Association, Connecticut Council for the Social Studies, New Jersey Council for the Social Studies, New York Council for the Social Studies, New England History Teachers' Association. The National Council for the Social Studies is **not** a sponsoring group. You must indicate the name of the organization. The pre-registration deadline is March 1, 2010. **All forms received after this date** are expected to pay a \$125.00 conference registration fee. If you have any questions you can call Lisa Estabrook at (207) 282-3361 x229. The form are on pages 68-70. Pre-registrations are not refundable after March 1, 2010 unless the conference is cancelled. Badges and tickets will be available at the registration desk which is located at the Exhibit Hall Entrance. **No** confirmation letters will be mailed out.

REGISTRATION—Everyone who attends all or part of the 41st NERC MUST REGISTER. Registration **at the conference** is \$125.00. Registration forms must be completely filled out with the payment in the form of cash, Mastercard, Visa, Discover, American Express, or a check. People who pay with purchase orders are charged more because of the extra costs associated with them (See page 69.). The registration booth is located at the Exhibit Hall Entrance. Pre-registration is strongly recommended. Participants, preregistered or not, receive their badges at the registration desk. Please wear these during the entire conference. Presentation of the badge is necessary for admittance to all meetings and to the exhibit. **ALL PARTICIPANTS, MCSS OFFICERS, PROGRAM COMMITTEE MEMBERS, PRESENTERS AND CONFEREES ARE REQUIRED TO PAY THE REGISTRATION FEE. There are no exceptions.** The forms are on pages 68-70.

DISTRICT PASSES—This is a new kind of registration for districts that would like to send more than one teacher on different days, but can't afford single registrations. For a \$175.00 pre-registration fee, a school district can purchase a pass that can be used by up to four teachers on different days. For example, teacher X could use the pass on Monday and Tuesday. Teacher Y could use it on Wednesday and Teacher Z on Thursday. The pass must be picked up in the morning at the registration desk and turned in each afternoon. No duplicates will be made if the pass is lost or taken from the conference. All users of the pass must be identified on the registration form located on page 68. On-site district pass registration costs \$200.00.

PRE-SERVICE TEACHER and RETIREE REGISTRATION—There is a student fee of \$25.00 for full time undergraduate students with I.D.'s. This category only applies to pre-service teachers. See page 68 for the form. Retirees also pay the special price of \$25.00.

CERTIFICATES OF ATTENDANCE—Certificates of Attendance are available. Please follow the directions on page 11.

EXHIBITS—An exhibit of teaching materials is located in the Hawthorne Exhibit Hall. Be sure to visit the exhibit area which is open Tuesday 7:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. and Wednesday 7:30 A.M. to 3:30 P.M. **There is no general exhibit on Monday or Thursday.** See pages 64-65 for details.

NAME BADGES—Name badges are proof of your registration at the conference and admit you to the clinics, sessions, and exhibits. Please remember to wear your badge at all times. Badges will be printed with the information indicated on the registration form.

NATURE OF PLANNED MEETINGS













2010 Massachusetts Council for the Social Studies Annual Meeting
